## 1. Introduction

Indonesia, surrounded by two continents and two oceans, is the largest country in Southeast Asia. In 2016, we had openSUSE.Asia Summit in Yogyakarta with more than 400 attendees. Bali is one of 17,000 islands in the Indonesian archipelago. The island is home to an ancient culture known for its warm hospitality. Exotic temples and palaces with stunning natural backgrounds are some of the main attractions.

Bali is an island and province of Indonesia part of the Coral Triangle, the area with the highest biodiversity of marine species. In this area alone, over 500 reef-building coral species can be found. For comparison, this is about seven times as many as in the entire Caribbean. Most recently, Bali was the host of the ASEAN Summit 2011, APEC 2013, Miss World 2013 and Annual Meetings of the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank Group 2018. Bali is the home of the Subak irrigation system, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It is also home to a unified confederation of kingdoms composed of 10 traditional royal Balinese houses, where each house rules a specific geographic area. The confederation is the successor of the Bali Kingdom.

- Provide a tutorial or troubleshooting in Indonesian, published on the site belongs to the community

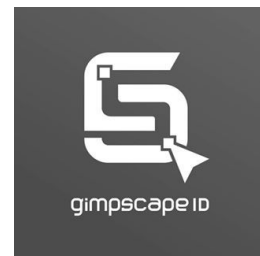

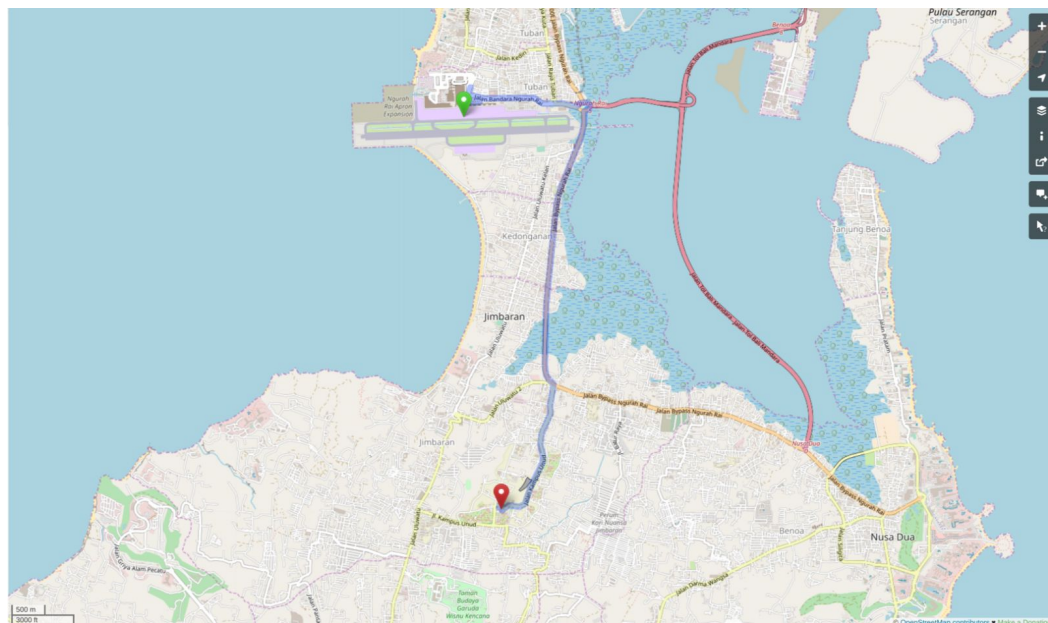
### 3. Objectives

Udayana University (ID: Universitas Udayana), is a public university in Bali. It was established on September 29, 1962. The university's name was derived from the 10th century Balinese King Udayana (Dharmodayana) of the Warmadewa Dynasty.

Built in 1986, Bukit Jimbaran Campus is the largest of Udayana's three campuses. It is designed like a town. Facilities include health clinic, university library, sport centre, post office, guesthouse and university housing. An international hospital, shopping centre, lake and leisure facilities are being made available soon. The campus is not far from Pecatu, in easy reach of Ngurah Rai International Airport and the major tourism sites of Kuta and Nusa Dua.

Udayana University has auditorium or hall named Widya Sabha located in Bukit Jimbaran Campus. The capacity is up to 800 people. All pictures below taken by Udayana University.

## 6. Visa

### 6.1. Visa Free

Nationals or passport holders of 169 countries (including Japan, China, Taiwan, South Korea, India, Hong Kong, Germany, United Kingdom, Spain, Australia, Netherland) are given visa-free entry facility for maximum of 30 days. The visa can be extended for another 30 days but cannot be transferred to another type of visa. All citizens from above mentioned countries have to enter Indonesia through a number of airports and seaports. For more information, please check

## 6.2. Visa on Arrival (VoA)

Visa on Arrival (VoA) may be obtained upon arrival at the designated airports, seaports and land border checkpoints in Indonesia at the discretion of Indonesian Immigration Officers at the point of arrival. VoA is valid for length of stay of up to 30 (thirty) days and extendable at the Immigration Offices in Indonesia for 1 (one) time only to have another stay of 30 (thirty) days, subject to the eligibility of sponsorship of the traveler's stay in Indonesia. To do so, travelers are advised to contact the nearest local Immigration Office in Indonesia. VoA cannot be converted into any other type of visa or stay permit in Indonesia.

Requirements:

- Passport with minimum 2 (two) blank pages with minimum validity of 6 (six) months upon the date of arrival in Indonesia;
- A confirmed return ticket; OR a confirmed one-way ticket as well as a ticket issued for traveling to other country after visiting Indonesia;

## 7.1. International Airplane

Bali Ngurah Rai International Airport, also known as Denpasar International Airport (IATA: DPS, ICAO: WADD), is located in southern Bali, 13 km South of Denpasar. It is Indonesia's third-busiest international airport.

## 7.2. Local

### Airplane

Bali Ngurah Rai International Airport serve most all flight from all domestic airport such as from Jakarta, Surabaya, Yogyakarta, Medan, Makassar, etc. Operational by various airline include Garuda Indonesia, Batik Air, Citilink, Lion Air, AirAsia, Sriwijaya Air etc. You can book flight from you favorite travel agent, or from their official website.

### Ferry

Ferry crossing is a MUST if you prefer land connection. At Java, the ferry point is called Ketapang. In Bali, the ferry terminal is at Gilimanuk. Denpasar, the capital of Bali or Kuta.

### Train

It is possible to travel with train to Bali if you are from various city in Java. But remember that the train will stopped at Banyuwangi Baru station. You must use bus and ferry to continue your trip to Bali.

## 8. Accomodation

### 8.1. Lodging

Bali has a wide variety of accommodation, ranging from budget lodging to good quality mid-range hotels to extravagant palaces with extravagant prices to match. There are many options for places to stay around venue. Below are list of hotels around the venue, top is the nearest

## 8.3. Taxi Fares

Access to the venue (Udayana University) from Ngurah Rai International Airport is about 9.3 km or around 30 minutes. You can use airport taxi, we recommend Blue Bird (<http://www.bluebirdgroup.com>). The fare is about \$4-\$5.

You can also use online transportation, among others.

## 8.4. Dining

Jimbaran Bali a three-kilometre long array of beachside cafés and a lineup of international restaurants make Jimbaran Bali's seafood heaven a must-visit gastronomic destination. Two main restaurant clusters dominate this culinary bazaar; the first on Kedonganan-Jimbaran Bay adjacent to Jimbaran fish market and the second on Muaya Beach, one kilometre south (on Jalan Pantai Muaya, also known as 'Jalan Four Seasons'). There are probably 40 restaurants in both areas, not to mention the hotel-based restaurants and cafés. If you are adventurous with your appetite, this is the only place that can abate your craving for seafood dishes.

### 9.1. Garuda Wisnu Kencana

Garuda Wisnu Kencana Cultural Park is a cultural park located in Ungasan, Badung Regency. GWK Cultural Park offers a lavish Indonesian cultural heritage for years to come with the upcoming monumental Garuda Wisnu Kencana Statue as the Indonesian Icon of civilization, the number one cultural icon in Bali. Garuda Wisnu Kencana statue is the symbol of God Vishnu riding the great Garuda as his trusted companion. The statue is designed to be one of the world's largest and highest monumental statue in the world. Total height of the statue is 120m, consists of 24 segments and formed with 754 modules made of copper and brass coated patina acid. More info <http://gwkbali.com/>.

## 9.2. Uluwatu Temple

Balinese temple to the sea gods, with a commanding view of the ocean high on a cliff. The temple is part of a series of temples built to protect the island from evil spirits and is the permanent home to a family of friendly monkeys. After exploring the temple and watching the sunset, experience one of Bali's most famous cultural performances, the Kecak Fire Dance. Watch the Balinese act out a scene from the Ramayana with a mesmerizing trance chant, punctuated by exciting fire dances by performers in intricate costumes. An unforgettable evening of Balinese culture that the whole family can enjoy.

### 9.3. Kecak Dance

The Kecak dance, or 'Tari Kecak', is a captivating traditional Balinese art performance, which also goes by, 'the monkey chant dance', and loosely 'fire dance', for its occasional use of fire as a centrepiece prop. The Kecak was created around 1930 and is now internationally recognised as one of Bali's top-three signature dances (alongside the Barong and Legong). The Kecak dance is unique in that it has no other musical background or accompaniment besides the chanting of male dancers, intoning a "keh-chack" polyrhythmic choir during most of the performance. Kecak's storyline is taken from the Ramayana Hindu epic and it's often on the entertainment schedule of almost every Balinese arts and culture venue. The best place to watch Tari Kecak is Uluwatu Temple.



#### 9.4. Kuta Beach

Kuta Beach's 2.5-kilometre stretch of cream-colored sand borders Legian to its north and Tuban (home of the Ngurah Rai International Airport) to its south. This beach on Bali's southwestern coast is perhaps the most popular resort area in Bali, and it's even more recognised among international visitors than the island itself – thanks to its combined features of sun, sand and surf. Surfing in Bali, often considered a key contributor to the rise of tourism in Bali, all started here.
